
## SPRING 2010 GRADUATE SURVEY

After hearing so much about the difficult economy, graduating students may feel uneasy when searching for a job. Many employers are looking for a perfect combination of a college degree and previous job experience. The <u>Coggin College of Business</u> offers numerous opportunities for students to expand their education, practical experience and professional network through a variety of programs. 
# GET TO KNOW: DARLINE BERNHEIMER
