

First Commencement Is Scheduled By UNF

The first commencement for the University of North Florida will be held in the campus courtyard at 4 p.m. Sunday for 34 students.

UNF President Dr. Thomas G. Carpenter will be the speaker.

"This first graduating class is a tangible representation of the university's community, the Northeast sector of the state and the state at large," Dr. Carpenter declared.

Candidates for both bachelor's and master's degrees will be honored during the program.

UNF was created and authorized by the state legislature in 1965 with Dr. Car-

penter appointed as president in 1969. The school opened last fall to 2,000 students.

The current building program will double the capacity of the school next winter.
