

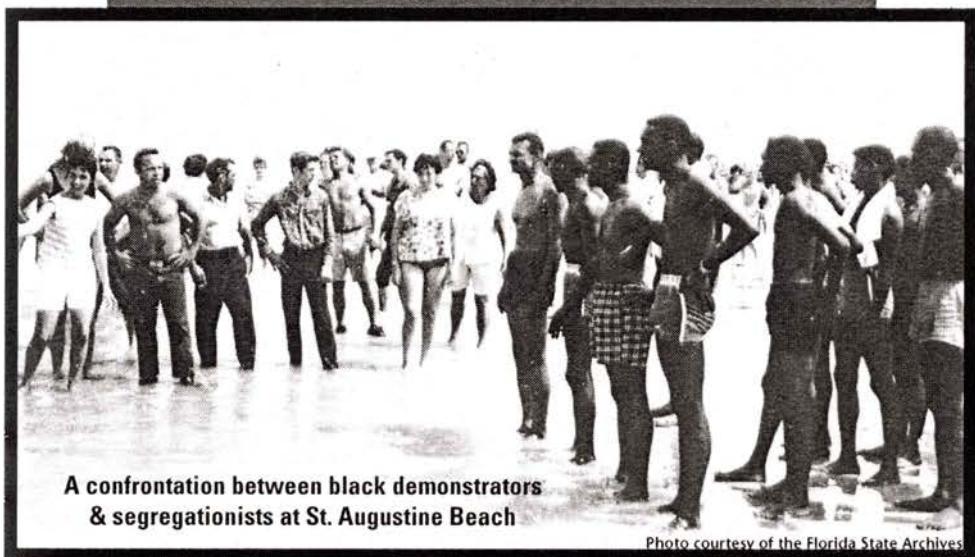

Welcome

On behalf of the Florida Studies Program of the University of South Florida, St. Petersburg, I would like to welcome you to the first major conference devoted to the history of the Civil Rights Movement in Florida. The capstone of the University's commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the landmark *Brown v. Board of Education* decision, the conference promises to be the largest gathering of Movement veterans and scholars in the state's history. Featuring panel discussions, performances, documentary films, and music, this unique four-day event incorporates historical scholarship and personal memories in an effort to deepen our understanding of the freedom struggle that transformed Florida's political and social landscape during the second half of the twentieth century. It is our hope that conference sessions will encourage wide-ranging and open discussions of both past and current challenges to the realization of democratic ideals in Florida. Free and open to the public, the conference is co-sponsored by the Florida Studies Program and the University Honors Program of the University of South Florida, St. Petersburg, the Florida Humanities Council, the Tampa Bay History Center, the Florida Studies Center of the University of South Florida Library System, the YWCA of Tampa Bay, Publix, and AARP Florida's Voices of Civil Rights Project.
