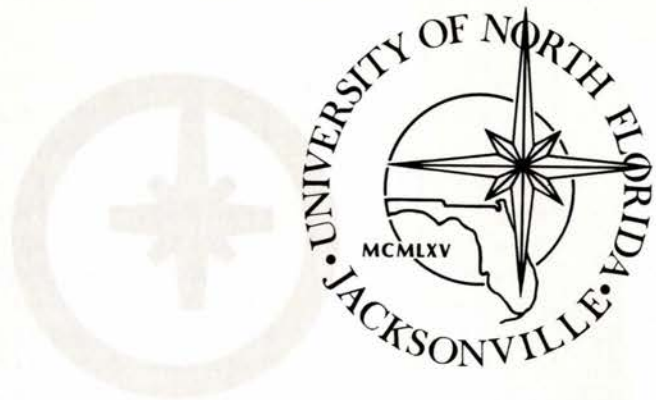

THE SEAL AND SYMBOL OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA

Two ancient devices - the circle and the compass rose - have been adopted and modified in creating a graphic symbol for the University of North Florida. The compass rose, long a direction-finding device for mariners, here symbolizes the University's role in providing direction for lives. The placement of the compass rose in the upper northeast quadrant of the circle describes the institution's upper division character and its location in northeast Florida. The circle itself signifies the community which the University is dedicated to serve.

The symbol was inspired by the University of North Florida seal, designed under the direction of President Thomas G. Carpenter. The seal will continue to be used on formal documents. The symbol, as a simpler representation of the seal, will be used in the University's publications and other communicative devices.
