The first Colored Society in the United States to receive admission as a department of the American Red Cross.

Permanent arrangement for a Colored Playground, Miss Eartha White's name on Committee.

The first to organize Canning Club among Colored in city. Have over 46.

Participated in Patriotic Parade given by Safety Committee.

Celebrated as usual: Good Health Week, Clean-Up Week, Baby Week, co-operating with White Woman's Clubs.

Participated in celebrations: Emancipation Day, Lincoln, Douglas and Washington Day, Memorial Day.

Held public platform meetings to get men to pay poll taxes and vote.

President and white friends secured a Colored County Canning Demonstrator.

The request in our last report relative to the Duval county stockade was granted, and too much praise cannot be given the County Commissioners for the wonderful improvement. Everything is now up-to-date, in a perfectly sanitary condition, with even a pool for bathing and a place for religious services.

Applied to City for a Social Worker. The same was granted.

Asked for a School Medical Inspector. Two nurses were given instead.

June 17th, Red Cross Night at Bethel Baptist Institutional Church.
