THE PROPELLER CLUB OF JACKSONVILLE - WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU!

The Propeller Club of Jacksonville is part of the International Propeller Club of the United States, a business network dedicated to the promotion of commerce, global trade and the maritime industry. Currently there are 80 Ports with 30 located internationally. The Port of Jacksonville is one of the original Ports chartered in 1930.

Through the establishment of Student Ports, the Propeller Club educates students about the opportunities in the maritime profession and helps develop an appreciation for the industry and its impact on national security and the economy. In 2000, the Transportation and Logistics Society at UNF became one of only 27 Student Ports in the U.S. All members enjoy dual membership in TLS and the Propeller Club Student Port at UNF

The Propeller Club of Jacksonville supports many TLS/Student Port activities throughout the year. Since 2001 the TLS/Student Port has collaborated with the Propeller Club on the Hubbard House Holiday Drive. Every year the Propeller Club hosts a networking reception so students can meet maritime professionals and learn more about the industry (this year on Feb. 7). Every spring the Propeller Club hosts Big Sea Day; a unique and unforgettable tour of JAXPORT (this year on Mar. 28). TLS on Tour: Target Distribution Center

Join us Friday, February 21st as we tour the Target distribution center in Lake City. This facility provides 400 thousand square feet of storage for refrigerated and frozen perishable products bound for Target stores in the southeast. Target utilizes a highly sophisticated Automated Storage and Retrieval System (ASRS), which maximizes space and minimizes the need for human resources. Automated systems optimize production, logistics and distribution processes in order to increase flexibility, responsiveness, and quality of service while minimizing logistics costs. The center was built in Lake City to take advantage of the strategic location near major roadways. LIFE AFTER GRADUATION: TAYLOR BARRY



Taylor Barry graduated with a T&L degree in December 2012. During her time at UNF Taylor was very active in TLS and served as Marketing Assistant, Marketing Director, and President. She participated in Career Day, facility tours and represented UNF at the IANA Expo in Atlanta. She said, "Holding the title of TLS President provided me with the opportunity to work and collaborate with a team and taught me to look ahead and plan for the unexpected." Taylor also obtained practical experience in the T&L field as a Truckload Logistics Specialist for Corporate Traffic, Inc., which really helped prepare her for a career in supply chain.

Taylor currently works as an Inventory Planning and Replenishment Analyst for the Home Depot in Atlanta, Georgia. She works 40-45 hours per week managing the inventory for 4 different classes of product in the lumber department nationwide. Her primary role is managing the parameters for each SKU in the central fulfillment system to determine when a store will automatically place an order for any particular item. Parameters she manages include minimum on hand quantity, minimum weeks of supply, service levels, committed stock, and various maximum parameters. Other duties include creating seasonal load-in strategies, working closely with merchants to manage classes, and keeping inventory levels low while remaining 99% in-stock.

Taylor offered a few words of advice for students in the T&L program. She said to "take advantage of as many opportunities as you can. The tours are an easy way to learn and visualize multiple supply chain concepts. The more experiences that you can gain while still in school, the more of an advantage you will have in interviews and in your professional career. I strongly recommend taking the Excel class. Unfortunately I did not take the class, but it would have been very beneficial especially now that I use Excel for heavy analysis every day. Participating on the TLS board is a great opportunity to learn business practices that will be invaluable when starting your career. Be sure to apply for the CTL through the blanket waiver program offered to UNF T&L graduates through the American Society of Transportation and Logistics. It is a professional designation that will set you apart throughout your career."
