The Office of Undergraduate Research (OUR) is pleased to introduce the inaugural volume of *PANDION: The Osprey Journal of Research & Ideas*, a collection of student research and creative project papers which spans the academic disciplines at the University of North Florida (UNF). *PANDION* is conceived primarily as an online journal, hosted in Digital Commons by the Thomas G. Carpenter Library, although it will appear in print on occasion. Volume 1 comprises two issues: No. 1, released online on July 31, 2020, and No. 2, released on August 31, 2020.

*PANDION* is not a peer-reviewed student research journal. Rather, each article in this volume was written by a UNF undergraduate or graduate student under the guidance of a subject matter expert – the faculty mentor named on the essay’s title page. I am grateful for the assistance and consistent support of Courtenay McLeland, Head of Digital Projects and Preservation at the Carpenter Library and Digital Editor of *PANDION*, and Michael Boyles of the Center for Instruction & Research Technology (CIRT), *PANDION*’s Art Director and Design Editor. We are all especially proud to have produced *PANDION* during the pandemic, working separately and together, collaborating remotely from our individual locations.

Finally, *PANDION* is interdisciplinary and publishes nominated articles which embody various reference styles (APA, MLA, Chicago/Turabian) according to the academic field.
