## ACADEMIC PLAN "IMPRESSIVE"

"I went to college thirty years too late," said Dr. Louis Murray, chairman of the Board of Regents curriculum committee, after hearing the University's revised academic plan as outlined at a meeting in Tampa Thursday. Vice President Lassiter and the academic deans unveiled the fleshed out plan before Dr. Murray and Regent J. J. Daniel of Jacksonville. Mr. Daniel's frequent comment: "Impressive---impressive."

In the words of President Carpenter, the University of North Florida has a more well-developed academic plan at its stage of growth than any new university in the state system he's been associated with. That includes all but one of the newer institutions.

Of particular interest to the Regents was the emphasis on liberal studies--those courses outside the student's major and related area. This represents a pioneering step by the University. Each department will be responsible for developing and staffing one course for non-majors. Dr. Willard O. Ash, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, said the departments will be directed to put their best professors in these courses so that the non-major will be truly enriched.

Copies of the plan are available in all offices. Of special interest to the staff will be the phasing schedule of bachelor's and master's degree programs.

The Academic Plan will also be presented to the President, Vice Presidents and Provosts of Florida Junior College next Tuesday (May 18) by members of our administrative staff. Purpose being that we will be working more closely with this junior college and feel that they should know what our academic plan will be upon opening in September, 1972, and offered as the UNF continues to grow. The presentation will be made at a luncheon at Strickland's Townhouse at Noon Tuesday.
