

S.M.A.R.T Technologies for Students who are Deaf with Disabilities

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INTRODUCTION

- Teachers report that using tablets equipped with educational apps have helped their students in various developmental domains such as: academic, language and communication, organization, social-emotional, and behavioral.
- Guardino, Cannon, & Silverman (October, 2017) presented a seminar on Free & Low Cost Technology Resources at Pacific Rim International Conference on Disability and Diversity in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- Guardino (2018) conducted a keynote presentation at the Florida Educators of Students who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing (FEDHH) Conference. During the presentation, teachers of the d/Deaf & Hard of Hearing (TODHH) identified strategies they use students who are Deaf with Disabilities (DWD).
- This poster is a combination of:
 - The apps that were most highly reported by TODHH who work with DWDs
 - The seminar resources that may meet the needs reported by teachers and service providers who work with DWDs
- All resources can be incorporated into the classroom using the S.M.A.R.T acronym:
 - Specific**-why is this app helpful?
 - Measurable**-how will data be collected using the app?
 - Attainable**-how much does the app cost?
 - Relevant**-why is this app useful for the learner(s)?
 - Time Bound**-How often will you check to determine the usefulness of the app?

Academic Content



GoNoodle
Cost: Free
Platform: Apple, Google Play & Website

- GoNoodle is a program that supplements activities inside of the classroom in a variety of different domains. For example, the app encourages students to get up and move and interact with the videos that are being shown.
- The videos on GoNoodle are categorized by themes such as curriculum, school life, social-emotional learning, sensory & motor skills, and mindfulness. All videos are captioned and have colorful text to support the audio message of the lesson.

Skitch

- Skitch is an application that allows users to annotate, markup, and draw on their work or picture after it is downloaded with the app.
- Teachers may use Skitch to have students diagram parts of speech, solve math problems, and even create entries for a visual dictionary.
- Skitch can be personalized by using a variety of buttons to add different colors, shapes, text, and arrows to draw attention to parts of user's work.

Language & Communication



Do2Learn

- Do2Learn is designed to be a teachers toolbox and has a variety of resources. This website is specifically designed for individuals with disabilities.
- One of the resources is a Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS), with free downloadable communication cards.
- Do2Learn also has a section developed on how to promote language with students; in addition to other academic, social, and behavioral resources.

Sign2TXT

- Sign2TXT utilizes American Sign Language (ASL) signs in a format similar to the PECS symbols. The app is part of the HandCraftEdASL Series by Angie Craft.
- This app also allows students to search for signs using handshapes, especially helpful for those who do not have strong spelling skills.
- Sign2TXT also allows students to use the ASL alphabet on the qwerty board to fingerspell words that are then presented in written English.

Organization & Planning



OneNote

- OneNote is a one stop platform to create interactive notebooks, supplemental materials, and organize your classroom.
- OneNote allows for integration of Word, PowerPoint, & Excel into a singular platform as well as integration of emails and notes into a singular place.
