UNF STAFF APPLICATION FOR ADMISSIONS

The Office of the Registrar would like to inform the UNF staff about the procedures in making application for admission to take courses here.

Any staff member who wishes to take a course must file the regular Application for Admission and pay the \$15 application fee. One must be eligible for admission to the University. If he wishes to enroll for degree credit, it is necessary for him to request that all previous transcripts be forwarded to the registrar's office. If he wishes to register as a special non-degree student, a statement of good standing which indicates class level (i.e. junior, senior, etc.) is necessary from the last school attended. All questions should be directed to the director of admissions and applications can be picked up from his office.

Waivers may be obtained to eliminate the registration fee for full-time staff and faculty members. An "Employee Request to Register Without Paying Fee" form is available in the personnel department. The request must be signed by the administrative head, and approved by the vice president and dean of faculties, and the department of personnel.
