

WILL L. HARDEE Honorary Alumnus

A native of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, Will L. Hardee was born on January 12, 1910. During his first 40 years, he lived in Fernandina Beach, Florida, moving permanently to Brownsville, Texas, in 1950.

Mr. Hardee's entire professional life has been devoted to the shrimp industry, and he has engaged in all facets of that business. He has owned his own business since 1935, currently serving as president of Sea Garden Sales Co., a marine and industrial supply firm. He also owns and operates a fleet of deep-sea shrimp trawlers operating out of Brownsville.

Before moving to Texas, Mr. Hardee served as vice president of the South Atlantic Shrimp Producers Association, in which are represented Florida, Georgia, and South Carolina producers.

Since relocating to Brownsville, Mr. Hardee has found himself involved in matters pertaining to the shrimp and other maritime industries on a local, regional, national, and international basis.

In the international area, Mr. Hardee has served as president of the Shrimp Association of the Americas, in which seven Southern states and Mexico are represented. He also served as chairman of the board of directors, International Shrimp Council, a world association of shrimp-producing countries or organizations thereof.

On the national level, he has served as president of the National Shrimp Congress; as a representative on the Fishing Industry Advisory Committee, U.S. Department of State; as a member of the Inter-Governmental Maritime Consultive Organization; and as a member of the subcommittee on Safety of Fishing Vessels of the U.S.

Regionally, Mr. Hardee is an advisor to the Commander, Eighth U.S. Coast Guard District, and was elected a director of the National Fisheries Association for Region Three.

He also served the Texas industry as a director of the Texas Shrimp Association and as president of SHRIMPAC, a political action committee of the state's industry.

On a local level, Mr. Hardee served two terms as president of the Brownsville Shrimp Producers Association as a member of the board of directors, First National Bank of Brownsville.

He has also served as a member of the executive committee of the Institute of Marine Science, University of Miami (Fla.) and member of the board of directors, Natural Resources Conservation, Development and Use organization of Texas A&M University.

A member of the Presbyterian church, Mr. Hardee has been very active in civic and fraternal organizations. A 32-degree Mason in both the Scottish and York Rite bodies, he has served as president of Shrine clubs in Florida and Texas and continues to be associated with Shrine temples in Jacksonville, San Antonio, and Corpus Christi.

He has served as chairman, board of trustees, Rio Grande Valley Shrine Club Crippled Children's Program since 1962, has twice served as a director of both the Brownsville Chamber of Commerce and Brownsville Kiwanis Club, was appointed an admiral in the Texas Navy by Gov. Price Daniel in 1962, and was presented a plaque by the Brownsville-Port Isabel Propeller Club as "Maritime Man of the Year" in 1966 for outstanding services to the maritime industry located in Brownsville and the Rio Grande Valley.

Several years ago, Mr. Hardee and his wife, Elnora, donated a site in Fernandina Beach for a public school, that facility ultimately becoming the Emma Love Hardee Elementary School. The Hardees also donated last year 37 acres of land to the Amelia Island Montessori School.

In December 1978, Mr. and Mrs. Hardee presented to the University of North Florida, through the UNF Foundation, Inc., a gift of 173 acres of land located in Fernandina Beach with an appraised value of \$434,000.
