### CAREER ADVISEMENT CRANKS UP

The UNF's innovative academic and career advisement program gets underway at 9 a.m. Monday (July 3), when thirteen UNF counselors meet for the first time.

The advisors will meet with President Carpenter and Vice President Lassiter to get acquainted with each other and the UNF before beginning an orientation period.

Under the direction of Dr. Johnny Arnette, associate dean of students, these counselors were carefully recruited for their interest in students. They will participate in an in-service training program for one month before the advisement of students begins in August.

Dr. Arnette and Dr. William Baggett, dean of students, have developed an integrated academic and career counseling program which will help students plan for not only their career goals, but their life goals as well.

The program will work in cooperation with support units such as psychological services and placement.

### UNF KEEPS ON TRUCKIN'

The cover story of the August issue of Florida Truck News, the journal of the Florida Trucking Association, will belong to the University of North Florida's department of transportation and logistics.

The article will be a written continuation of a presentation given by Dr. Warren Rose, chairman of the department, to the association's Board of Directors. A few weeks ago, in Sarasota, Dr. Rose explained how the UNF can serve the trucking industry of Florida through the transportation education provided here.

Dr. Rose will attend another such meeting of the Board of Directors at Ponte Vedra in September.

Dr. Rose will also address the Jacksonville Womens Traffic Association at the Corral Restaurant Tuesday, July 11, discussing "Transportation Education--Who Needs It?"

HEALTH INSURANCE  
BENEFITS INFO

As you were advised, the Blue Cross daily room rates will be increased from \$28 to \$40 effective July 1. The major medical coverage has been supplemented by another \$25,000 policy effective June 1. The coverage will now operate in this manner: after a \$500 deductible amount, the insurance will cover 80 percent of charges, up to a payment of \$30,000 and 90 percent of charges beyond that until a maximum of \$50,000 is paid.
