In the August 14 newsletter of the Florida State Department of Education, Floyd T. Christian, Commissioner, quoted Atty. Gen.

Chevin as stating that "a state employee or officer may participate in his own or another's campaign as long as he does not misuse his official authority to coerce or wrongfully influence another's vote, interfere with an election, or solicit monetary contributions from other public employees or officers. UNF PROFESSOR ON
SUMMER TOUR

William A. Brown, opera and concert tenor, recently appointed associate professor of music at the University of North Florida is currently engaged in an extensive national tour. He has just finished eight performances of Mozart's "The Abduction From The Seraglio" with the Harford Opera Theater, Maryland. He performed the role of Belmonte to critical acclaim.

He will perform Benjamin Britten's "Serenade for Horn and Tenor" with the Bear Valley Music Festival in San Francisco. In addition to solo recitals in Vermont and New York, he will sing five performances as the tenor lead in Verdi's "La Traviata" with the Detroit Symphony beginning August 26. These performances at the Detroit Symphony Summer Theatre Festival will conclude his summer tour after which he will resume his duties as a member of the fine arts department faculty.
