Students from the Venture Studies course, "Genetics and Society," department of natural sciences and their instructor, Dr. G. J. Stine, attended the Jacksonville Hospitals Educational Program Symposium on Abortion held at the Hilton Hotel, Nov. 17-18 (Fri. and Sat.).

Participants in the symposium included Dr. Alan F. Guttmacher, president of Planned Parenthood World Population; Ray Marky, assistant state attorney general, and Howard Moody, National Clergy Consultation Service on Abortion and others. Many aspects of abortion were presented; methods, procedures, economics and moral implications.

Representatives of the Duval County Right to Life Society were present at the Hilton at the same time. In a separate presentation they used slides and supplementary monologue to discourage termination of pregnancy through abortion.
