#### The University of North Florida

The University of North Florida was authorized by the 1965 Florida Legislature and created to meet the higher educational needs of northeast Florida. UNF opened its doors in 1972, initially as a two-year, upper division institution. Freshman and sophomore programs were added in 1984.

One of nine State University System of Florida institutions, UNF is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Business programs have been accredited by the American

Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business; teacher education programs, by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education; the computer science program, by the Computing Sciences Accreditation Board; and the nursing program, by the National League of Nursing.

UNF now has more than 13,000 alumni, most of whom live and work within the University's service region.

#### The Commencement Ceremony

The commencement ceremony, as we witness it today, has its roots in the academic traditions and heritage passed on by European universities of the 14th century. While the ceremony itself has been modified to conform with modern times, the academic dress of faculty and graduates carry vestiges of medieval times and reflect the every-day dress of the Middle Ages. Once the symbol of rank or class, the dress today represents tradition and achievement. The cap, now a flat "mortar board," once was soft, full and draped.

Today's graduates and faculty fall into three categories of gowns. The baccalaureate candidate or graduate wears a robe with long, open sleeves, but without the distinctive hood. The colored tassel on the baccalaureate cap identifies the discipline in which a degree has been earned. The master's candidate or graduate wears a robe with long, closed sleeves, the sleeves being slit near the upper part of the arm to accommodate hand movement. This candidate wears an abbreviated hood lined in satin with the colors of the degree-granting institution and edged in velvet with a color which signifies the discipline in which the degree was earned.

Faculty holding doctoral degrees wear robes with round, open sleeves ornamented with velvet stripes. While doctoral robes normally are black, many have been specially designed in various colors by the granting institution or degree recipient. The doctoral hood is larger than the master's, but the color scheme is identical.

# The Jacksonville Light Infantry Color Guard

The Jacksonville Light Infantry Color Guard was established by UNF's Army ROTC Detachment and is composed of ROTC cadets enrolled in that program. Formation of the color guard resulted from several years of planning and research and was made possible by a Student Government Association grant to purchase authentic period uniforms and replica weapons.

The color guard commemorates the Jacksonville Light Infantry Company, formed in April 1857. During the Civil War, this company saw action as part of Confederate forces' Company "A," 3rd Florida Infantry. It fought in the battles of Chattanooga, Perryville during the Kentucky campaign, Murfreesborough, Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge, the Mississippi campaign, and Atlanta against Union General William Tecumseh Sherman. The J.L.I. was demobilized in April 1865.

The company was reactivated in 1880 to assist with the Mill Riot and, at that time, established its distinctive uniform. In 1898, the J.L.I. volunteered for service during the Spanish-American War, but saw no action. During World War I, the J.L.I. served overseas as a company of the 1st Separate Battalion, fighting against Imperial German forces. Mustered out in 1918, it was never reformed.

The J.L.I. Color Guard represents UNF in a variety of community events and celebrations.
