Highlights in Jazz Series Features Red Norvo

The "Soft Swinging Sounds" that provided the title for the Highlights in Jazz concert at the Loeb Auditorium on Thursday evening also provided this long-running jazz series with one of its best and best-balanced programs.

The Red Norvo/Tal Farlow Trio, in which the vibraharpist and the guitarist were backed by Steve Novosel on bass, brought together two old masters of soft swing. A counterpart, in age at least, was provided by Mike Peters's String Fever, a young quintet focused on guitar, mandolin and cello. And as a centerpiece, there was Maxine Sullivan who introduced a soft, swinging approach to jazz singing with her interpretation of folk songs in the mid-30's.

Mr. Peters's group, formed only last summer, showed that it is already building a promising repertoire based on the unusual combination of Hank Roberts's cello and Mr. Peters's guitar and mandolin, backed by Tony Ragusas, piano; Chris Berg, bass, and Ed Stockholm, drums. Their material included a Django Reinhardt composition, an instrumental arrangement of Louis Chauvin's charming piano rag, "Heliotrope Bouquet," and several original pieces, most notably an Ellington-like pastel by Mr. Berg.

Miss Sullivan, who is 70 years old, and Mr. Norvo, 73, have become ageless as performers. Miss Sullivan's voice seemed even stronger and more assured than usual and Mr. Norvo's light and airy finesse has become brilliantly entwined with Mr. Farlow's urgently rhythmic lines.

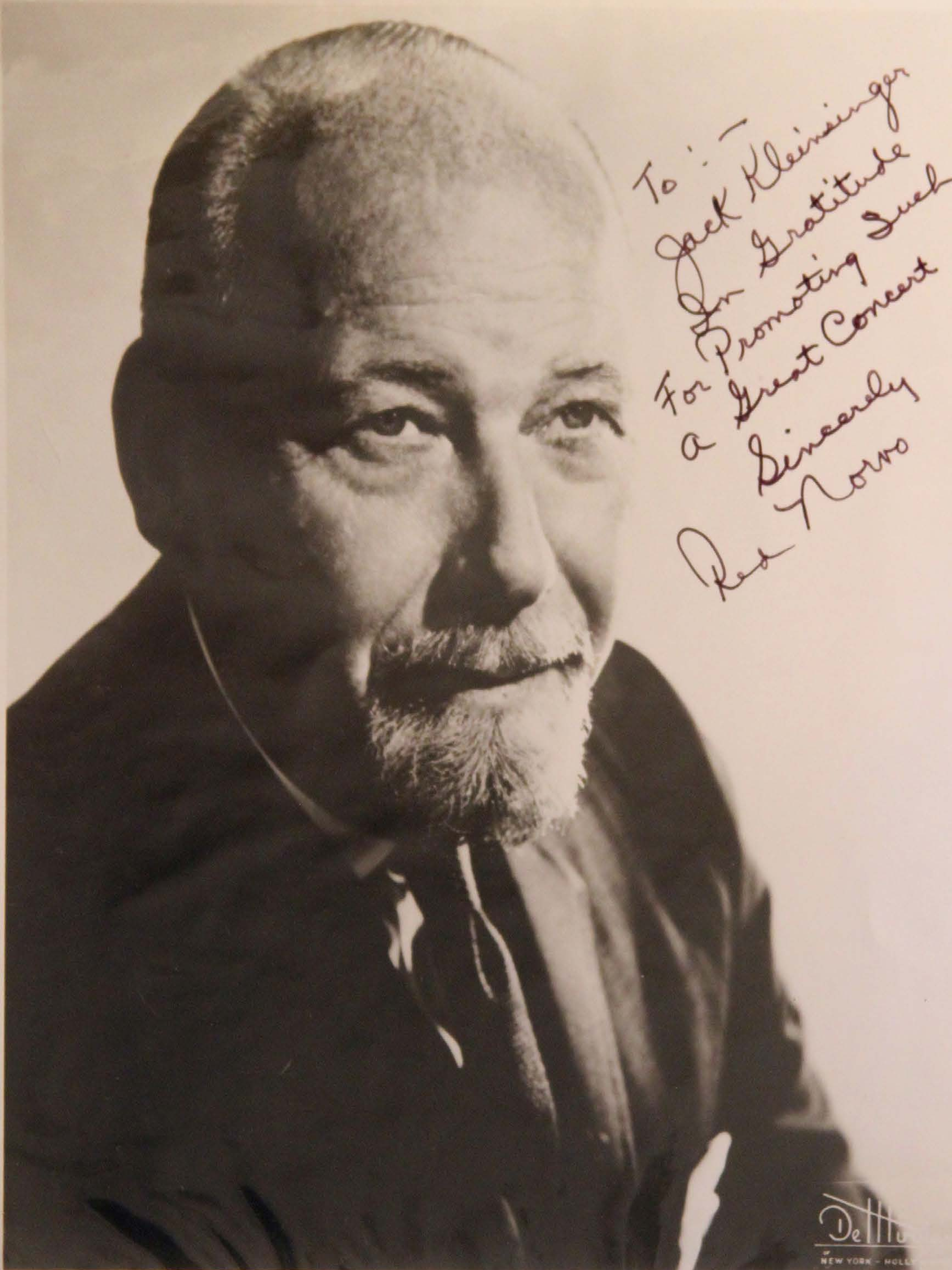


