One of America's most honored journalists, Gwen Ifill (1955–2016) was among the first African Americans to hold prominent positions in both broadcast and print journalism.

After working at newspapers and NBC, Ifill joined PBS in 1999 as host of *Washington Week*, the first woman and first African American to moderate a major television news-analysis show. In 2013, she became co-anchor of the *PBS NewsHour*, part of the first all-female team to anchor a national nightly news program.

Ifill received many honors, including the 2015 National Press Club Fourth Estate Award and the 2016 John Chancellor Award, awarded posthumously by the Columbia Journalism School. Her alma mater, Simmons University, opened the Gwen Ifill College of Media, Arts, and Humanines in the fall of 2018.

Among the nation's most admired journalists, Ifill brought clarity and honesty to her work. Her commitment to the public interest made her a standard-bearer for journalistic fairness, courage, and integrity.


