

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER DR. CURTIS L. MCCRAY PRESIDENT, MILLIKIN UNIVERSITY DECATUR, ILLNOIS

Dr. McCray, who also holds the rank of professor of English, has served as Millikin's 11th president since March 1, 1993. Previously he was president of California State University – Long Beach for five years and President of the University of North Florida from 1982 to 1988.

The Millikin president is chairman of Decatur Advantage 20/ 20, the city's long-range strategic planning effort, and a member of the boards of the Metro. Decatur Chamber of Commerce and Partners in Education. Dr. McCray is a member of the NCAA Presidents Council, a 44-member body that reviews and proposes legislation for college athletics. He also is a member of the Non-Publice Advisory Council for the Illinois Board of Higher Education and a member of the executive committees of The Associated Colleges of Illinois and the Federation of Independent Illinois Colleges and Universities. A frequent speaker before community and professional groups, he has served on numerous special committees, including review teams for higher education accreditation agencies.

Dr. McCray is a native of Indiana and his parents still live in Wheatland near Vincennes. He is a graduate of Knox College, received a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship for graduate study at the University of Pennsylvania and earned his Ph.D. in English at the University of Nebraska. He taught English at Nebraska, Cornell College in Iowa and Saginaw Valley State University in Michigan before launching an administrative career. He was dean of the School of Arts and Sciences at Saginaw Valley State and later vice president for academic affairs there before serving five years as provost/vice president for academic affairs at Governors State University near Park Forest, south of Chicago.

He helped Long Beach State develop numerous capital projects, including a \$13 million School of Business Administration building and a \$37 million performing arts center. Dr. McCray created a 24-member Board of Governors to advise the president on fund-raising and investments, initiated a study of public-private partnerships to develop campus facilities, and encouraged creation of commissions on the status of women and the status of ethnic minorities on campus. He was involved in numerous community activities and is a past president of Leadership Long Beach and a former director of the United Way of Los Angeles.

Dr. McCray and his wife, Mary, have three daughters. Mrs. McCray grew up in Galesburg and is a graduate of Knox College.

DECEMBER 1996 SENIOR SERVICE AWARD LOUANNE BIRCH HAWKINS

LouAnne Birch Hawkins, a senior at UNF majoring in psychology, represents the highest standards which have come to be expected of University of North Florida students. Ms. Hawkins has worked tirelessly in the community and on campus as a volunteer. For this reason, she has been named the December 1996 Senior Service Award Winner.

Ms. Hawkins' efforts to give back to the community are evident in her numerous volunteer activities. While attending the University of North Florida, she studied American Sign Language, a challenging yet rewarding course. She was able to use this new form of communication with her students at the Florida School for the Deaf and Blind. As a volunteer in the FSDB's mental health department, Ms. Hawkins offers an art therapy class working one on one with individuals with severe emotional problems.

Hawkins continues to make an impact with her participation as a volunteer in professional and community education. She volunteers as a public speaker and instructor at local medical conferences and military settings and as a visiting instructor at the University of Florida's Physician Assistant Program. She serves as President of Psi Chi, a psychology honor society, and most recently was recognized as the recipient of the 1996 Albert D. Ernest, Jr. Caring Award.

Ms. Hawkins also initiated the Baby Keepsake Program to help grieving parents who have experienced loss of an infant through stillbirth or neonatal mortality. Through the Baby Keepsake Program, parents are able to hold the body of their stillborn infant and are provided with a lock of hair or a tiny footprint.

Ms. Hawkins plans to pursue a Ph.D. in clinical psychology and to continue working with deaf children. She hopes to use her profession to increase community awareness on mental health issues involving children and the deaf community. Hawkins quotes George Eliot, "Our deeds determine us, as much as we determine our deeds." No doubt, Ms. Hawkins' selfless acts of kindness will continue to make an impact on the community as well as individuals.

TRADITIONS OF THE COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

Academic regalia date to European universities of the Middle Ages, when gowns and hoods were required for warmth in unheated buildings. Gowns were furlined adaptations of the priestly toga, and hoods were worn to protect the tonsured heads of the priests. The regalia now serve as a visible reminder of the historic antecedents of intellectual pursuits.

In American universities of the late 19th century, these medieval costumes were revived to lend color to academic functions. Efforts were made to establish a code that would set standards for academic dress. Gowns of masters and doctors are generally ankle length and closed in front. The master's gown has pointed sleeves that are slit at the elbows. The doctoral gown has wide lapels of velvet, either black or the color of the scholar's specialization. The sleeves are full and bellshaped, with three velvet chevrons, either black or colored like the lapels. Gowns normally are black, although some universities have designed their own in the colors of the institution.

The hood, which drapes over the back of the gown, carries the greatest symbolism of all components of the academic costume. Its length, width and colors denote the wearer's highest academic achievement and institution. The master's hood is pointed; the doctoral hood is bellshaped. The color of the border of the hood indicates the scholar's major field of study; the lining color or colors identifies the institution that conferred the wearer's degree. Hoods were originally trimmed in fur, but now have satin borders for masters' and velvet for doctors' hoods.

The customary head covering is the mortarboard, or Oxford cap, with a tassel on the left side. Persons who possess the doctorate wear a tassel of gold metallic threads. The soft, large beret, modeled after the cap of Cambridge University, also has been adopted by some institutions.

The medieval university was much concerned with rank and privilege, and academic robes made visible the social and academic distinctions of the wearers. These distinctions have largely disappeared, and robes now indicate specialization. The following colors are associated with the degrees frequently represented in academic processions:

THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA

The University of North Florida (UNF), one of ten institutions within the State University System, is a comprehensive urban university that offers degree programs at the bachelor's, master's, and doctorate levels. Established in 1965 on 1,000 acres of wildlife preserve as an upper division and professional graduate institution, the University began offering classes in 1972. Freshmen and sophomores were added to the student body in 1984. In 1989, Dr. Adam W. Herbert assumed leadership of UNF as its third president.

The University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Some professional associations offer further accreditation of specific programs. UNF programs in business administration, teacher education, computer science, and nursing have been accorded national accreditation.

As UNF grows, it is proud of maintaining a reputation for excellence which attracts a diverse group of highly qualified students. The 1996 freshman class had a mean SAT score of 1100 (compared with a national average score of 1013) and a grade point average of 3.2. One quarter of our freshmen have a 4.0 GPA or better and almost half earned 16 or more college credits in high school. More than one-third were in the top 10 percent of their graduating class. Minority students comprise 19.8% of the student body. International students make up nearly 4.5% of the mix: 487 students from 104 countries around the world. 60% of UNF students are women; the average student age is 27.

Academic programs are built on a strong foundation in the traditional arts and sciences. The University offers 41 undergraduate degrees in 63 majors, 22 master's degree programs in 40 fields, and one doctoral degree. The University is organized into Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education and Human Services, Health, and Computing Sciences and Engineering.

UNF is dedicated to excellence in teaching, research, and public service. The University's faculty is committed to providing highquality instruction, with particular emphasis on undergraduate education. The faculty's publications and other creative activity demonstrate a determination to remain at the cutting edge of intellectual inquiry and practice in their respective disciplines. The University — through centers and institutes as well as traditional educational offerings and activities — is a major contributor to the community life of northeast Florida and, indeed, to the larger community.

Through the strong support of the University of North Florida Foundation Inc. and the generosity of both corporate leaders and dedicated citizens of Florida's First Coast region, UNF now has four Eminent Scholar Chairs: the Andrew A. Robinson Chair in Educational Policy and Economic Development, the Ira M. Koger Chair in American Music, the Prime F. Osborn Chair in Transportation, and the National Paper Trade Association Endowed Research Chair in Wholesaling. The UNF Foundation, funded by contributions, supports a wide range of UNF's activities on campus and in the community.

The University currently enrolls over 11,000 students annually. It has 423 faculty and more than 1,400 full-time and part-time staff. UNF now grants over 2,200 Bachelor's and Master's degrees each year.
