AS Irving Berlin turns 95, musicians everywhere are showing their gratitude in the best way they know how: by playing and singing his songs.

Pianist Steve Ross celebrates Berlin all this month in the Oak Room of the famed Algonquin Hotel on 44th Street. Ross plays and sings Berlin hits familiar and rare, sophisticated and simple, Wednesdays through Saturdays at 9:30 p.m., and Sundays from 5:30 p.m.

Whether beloved favorites — *Easter Parade*, *I've Got My Love to Keep Me Warm* or *Blue Skies* — or less common treasures — *I Used To Be Color Blind*, *It Only Happens When I Dance With You* — Ross knows them all and shares them happily. Reservations: 840-0900.

Saturday at 8 p.m. a clutch of top jazz names will pay homage in *A Jazz Portrait of Irving Berlin*, a *Highlights in Jazz* concert at NYU's Loeb Student Center.

In the NYU concert, pianist Dick Hyman will lead his Perfect Jazz Repertory Quintet — trumpeter Joe Wilder, reedman Phil Bodner, bassist Milt Hinton and drummer Mel Lewis — through a wise and witty Berlin program also offering vocals by the superb Carrie Smith. Any portrait of Mr. Berlin's bulging portfolio of song must be representative rather than complete, but you can be reasonably sure that you will be on a familiar foot-tapping basis with much of the program.
