Among the things they still make as they used to, and often with the same people, is jazz of years gone by, as

you can learn for yourselves at the "Highlights in Jazz" concert tonight at 8 in New York University's Loeb Student Center, 566 LaGuardia Place, at Washington Square South (598-3757).

The theme is "Harlem Memories," which, of course, brings to mind such period citadels as the Savoy Ballroom, the Cotton Club and the Apollo Theater. This mood will be evoked by two groups of musicians, most of them veterans of the era. Panama Francis, the drummer, and his nine-member Savoy Sultans were well known as the house band of the Savoy. In the six-man Harlem Blues and Jazz Band are such jazz names as Eddie Durham, trombonist, arranger for such as Jimmy Lunceford and Count Basie and credited as the first to play the amplified jazz guitar, and Al Casey, a guitarist in the New Orleans tradition.
