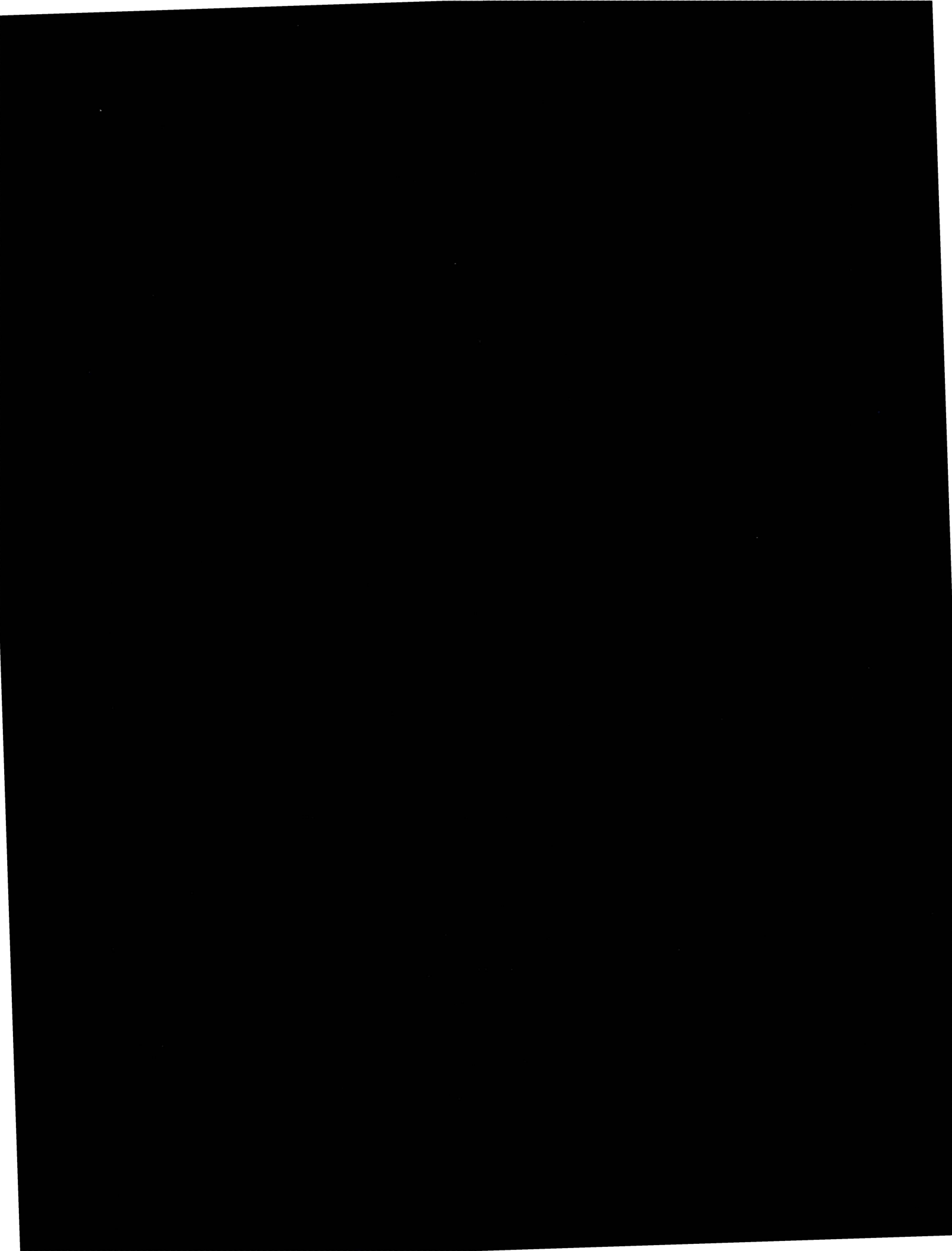

President John A. Delaney

Since becoming the fifth permanent president of UNF in July 2003, **John A. Delaney** has been working with students, faculty, staff, the Board of Trustees and the community on a vision that leads the University on a “journey to greatness.” This journey is guided by four principles: a commitment to excellence, focus, relevance and accountability.

The University’s definition of excellence begins with a focus on quality instruction and learning opportunities for students. Excellence also includes identifying flagship programs that offer the greatest opportunity to provide leadership in the community and the nation. UNF’s commitment to relevance includes partnerships to help solve problems in the community and to help to increase opportunities for students and faculty. The University’s commitment to accountability is based upon the understanding that UNF has a responsibility to taxpayers, donors, and students.

Delaney’s presidency continues a distinguished career as a public servant. He was mayor of Jacksonville for two consecutive terms. Before being elected mayor, Delaney served as the city’s general counsel and chief of staff to former Jacksonville Mayor Ed Austin. Delaney began his career as a prosecutor in the State Attorney’s Office.

Delaney received his undergraduate and law degrees from the University of Florida.

FALL 2005 SENIOR SERVICE AWARD

TATIANA MELNIK

Tatiana Melnik has been selected by the UNF Alumni Association as the recipient of the Senior Service Award for the December 2005 graduating class. The UNF Alumni Association selects a graduating senior each semester for outstanding service to the University and the community through volunteerism.



Tatiana is graduating today with a G.P.A. of 3.92 and a double major in International Business and Information Systems. Since May of 2000, she has been the co-owner of The Cyber Web, Inc. an internet service provider in Jacksonville, Florida. In addition to her employment and academic work, Tatiana has logged numerous hours in volunteer service.

Tatiana has become well known on the UNF campus and in the community. She is a member of the University Scholars National Honor Society, an exclusive organization that includes only 20 of UNF's top students who excel in their academic ability, leadership skills and commitment to service. Tatiana is also a member of the Phi Kappa Phi National Honor Society and the Golden Key National Honor Society. She has served as a Presidential Envoy since 2001 and was active in Student Government from 2002-2003. She is also a member of several student committees including Parking Appeals, Student Conduct, and Academic Appeals. Her off-campus volunteer involvement includes serving as the UNF Coordinator for Heart of America - Books from the Heart; participating in Dignity U Wear and Disney's Boggy Creek Camp for terminally ill children; and volunteering with Hubbard House, a domestic violence shelter in downtown Jacksonville. Throughout her volunteer service, Tatiana has held various leadership positions in almost all of the above mentioned organizations.

Although Tatiana feels that all volunteer experience is important, her most rewarding work was the coordination of Kids Fest 2005, an annual event hosted by the Presidential Envoys which focuses on familiarizing disadvantaged youth in Jacksonville with the college campus. Many of the 600 children who attended had never visited a college campus and were intimidated by the experience. Through providing children with free toys, games, food and a safe welcoming environment, they associate this positive experience with college which hopefully encourages them to pursue higher education. Through this experience, Tatiana learned that one can make an impact on people's lives. When she asked the children who attended if they planned to go to college some responded with hope in their eyes and said: "I like it here." For Tatiana, giving children hope is priceless. "Coming from a third world country, I know first hand the benefits of education and Kid's Fest allowed me to share this knowledge with others."

Tatiana's hard work, scholarship and humanitarianism have not gone unnoticed by the broader community. This year, she was presented with the Raymond "Trey" Gage Scholarship and the Joe and Janet Nicosia Endowed Scholarship in Leadership, both awarded yearly to one student in the Coggin College of Business for exemplary commitment to service. She also received the 2005 UNF Women's Center Leadership Scholarship, was selected as the 2005 Presidential Envoy of the Year, and was a financial award recipient for the Albert D. Ernest Caring Award in 2003 and 2004. In all, Tatiana has logged countless hours of volunteer community service. She has definitely made an impact at UNF and in the Jacksonville community. Smart, well rounded, selflessly driven, and generous, Tatiana embodies the spirit of University of North Florida students and alumni. She truly characterizes what the Senior Service Award represents.

Academic regalia date to European universities of the Middle Ages, when gowns and hoods were required for warmth in unheated buildings. Gowns were furlined adaptations of the priestly toga, and hoods were worn to protect the tonsured heads of the priests. The regalia now serve as a visible reminder of the historic antecedents of intellectual pursuits.

In American universities of the late 19th century, these medieval costumes were revived to lend color to academic functions. Efforts were made to establish a code that would set standards for academic dress. Gowns of masters and doctors are generally ankle length and closed in front. The master's gown has pointed sleeves that are slit at the elbows. The doctoral gown has wide lapels of velvet, either black or the color of the scholar's specialization. The sleeves are full and bell-shaped, with three velvet chevrons, either black or colored like the lapels. Gowns normally are black, although some universities have designed their own in the colors of the institution.

The hood, which drapes over the back of the gown, carries the greatest symbolism of all components of the academic costume. Its length, width and colors denote the wearer's highest academic achievement and institution. The master's hood is pointed; the doctoral hood is bellshaped. The color of the border of the hood indicates the scholar's major field of study; the lining color or colors identifies the institution that conferred the wearer's degree. Hoods were originally trimmed in fur, but now have satin borders for masters' and velvet for doctors' hoods.

The customary head covering is the mortarboard, or Oxford cap, with a tassel on the left side. Persons who possess the doctorate wear a tassel of gold metallic threads. The soft, large beret, modeled after the cap of Cambridge University, also has been adopted by some institutions.

The medieval university was much concerned with rank and privilege, and academic robes made visible the social and academic distinctions of the wearers. These distinctions have largely disappeared, and robes now indicate specialization. The following colors are associated with the degrees frequently represented in academic processions:

THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA

The University of North Florida (UNF), one of 11 public institutions in the State of Florida, is a comprehensive urban university that offers degree programs at the bachelor, masters, and doctorate levels. Established in 1965 as an upper division and professional graduate institution, the University began offering classes in 1972. Freshmen and sophomores were added to the student body in 1984. UNF's scenic campus is now nestled among 1300 acres which includes a nature and wildlife area with lakes and nature trails.

The University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award the Baccalaureate, Masters, and Doctor of Education Degrees. Some professional associations offer further accreditation of specific programs. UNF programs in athletic training, building construction management, business administration, civil engineering, computer science, electrical engineering, information systems, music, nursing, nutrition, physical therapy, public administration, rehabilitation counseling, and teacher education have been accorded national accreditation.

As UNF grows, it is proud of maintaining a reputation for excellence which attracts a diverse group of highly qualified students. The Fall 2005 freshman class had a mean SAT score of 1160 and a grade point average of 3.60. The minimum scores typically expected for admission are a sliding scale equivalent of 1000 on the SAT (or the ACT equivalent) and a GPA of 3.0. Twenty-three percent were in the top 10 percent of their graduating class. Minority students comprise 21.5% of the student body. International students make up nearly 1.5% of the mix: 240 students from 67 countries around the world. 59% of UNF students are women; the average student age is 24.7.

Academic programs are built on a strong foundation in the traditional arts and sciences. The University now has a student body of over 15,300 students enrolled in 50 undergraduate degree programs with 114 areas of concentration, 29 masters degree programs with 77 areas of concentration, and one doctoral degree. It has 490 faculty and more than 900 full-time and part-time staff. UNF now grants over 2,700 Bachelor, Masters, and Doctoral degrees each year through its College of Arts and Sciences, Coggin College of Business, College of Education and Human Services, College of Health, and College of Computing, Engineering, and Construction.

UNF is dedicated to excellence in teaching, research, and public service. The University's faculty is committed to providing high-quality instruction, with particular emphasis on undergraduate education. The faculty's publications and other creative activity demonstrate a determination to remain at the cutting edge of intellectual inquiry and practice in their respective disciplines. The University — through centers and institutes as well as traditional educational offerings and activities — is a major contributor to the community life of northeast Florida and, indeed, to the larger community.

Through the strong support of the University of North Florida Foundation Inc. and the generosity of both corporate leaders and dedicated citizens of Florida's First Coast region, UNF now has four Eminent Scholar Chairs: the Andrew A. Robinson Chair in Educational Policy and Economic Development, the Ira M. Koger Chair in American Music, the Prime F. Osborn Chair in Transportation, and the Paper Plastics Education Research Foundation Endowed Chair for Supply Chain Management. The UNF Foundation, funded by contributions, supports a wide range of UNF's activities on campus and in the community.
