Fourteen years ago, on Feb. 5, 1973, Jack Kleinsinger, then a 36-year-old Assistant Attorney General for the State of New York and an enthusiastic jazz fan, became a jazz impersario. Although he had never presented a concert of any kind before, he booked the tiny theater De Lys on Christopher Street for two nights, one month apart, to put on programs he called "Highlights in Jazz."

The fact that Mr. Kleinsinger intended to make "Highlights in Jazz" a series of concerts was implicit in his booking of two nights. He carried out that early intention so well that "Highlights in Jazz" will celebrate its 14th anniversary on Thursday at New York University's Loeb Auditorium, La-Guardia Place at Washington Square South,

the series fourth home. For the anniversary, three of the musicians who played at Mr. Kleinsinger's first concert will return - the tenor saxophonist Al Cohn, the guitarist Bucky Pizzarelli and the trumpter Joe Newman. In addition, there will be a debut: The virtuoso trombonist Phil Wilson, a star of one of Woody Herman's greatest bands, the 1962-65 group that included Bill Chase, Sal Nistico, Nat Pierce and Jake Hanna, will make his first appearance at "Highlights." For the past 20 years, Mr. Wilson has been head of the trombone department at Berklee College in Boston where he also teaches arranging and composition.

The singer Carrie Smith, the bassist Major Holley and the drummer Oliver Jackson will also be part of the anniversary program along with Mr. Kleinsinger's customary "surprise guest."


