JAZZ EDUCATION

Summer Jazz Institute, a seven-week professional training program focusing on vocal and instrumental jazz instruction, was offered in July and August by the Washington Jazz Institute, a non-profit education and performance oriented organization, the executive director of which is Bob Wilson, who was formerly with Lettcomplay.

The National Music Camp of Interlochen Center for the Arts played host to the Preservation Hall Jazz Band in August and among the camp's students was 17-year old Benji Jaffe, who has very special ties with the New Orleans hall. His father, the late Allan Jaffe, and his mother, Sandra Jaffe, founded Preservation Hall a quarter century ago. Benji, who plays the baritone horn and the bass fiddle, participated in the camp jazz ensemble, took a jazz improvisation class, and joined in jam sessions at the Interlochen summer institute.

New York University's Loeb Student Center will be the scene of "Piano Playin' Women" on October 20th when the Dorothy Donegan Trio and the Judy Carmichael Combo with Warren Vache, Michael Hashim, and Chris Flory perform. The same location will see "Dynamic Duos," Art Hodes-Doc Cheatham and Bucky Pizzarelli-John Pizzarelli, on November 17th.
