Kids to College

Kids to College is an innovative early college awareness program supported by Sallie Mae. The program matches sixth-grade classes, most in inner-city schools, with local colleges or universities in a six-week curriculum combining hands-on activities with information on careers, college life, and how to prepare for education beyond high school. College staff and students visit the sixth-graders to talk about college life. Parents learn about how to prepare their children for higher education and the availability of financial aid.

The highlight of the program is a "Day on Campus" for the students and their parents or guardians. Students often explore the campus through a scavenger hunt and take part in a hands-on activity such as a basic science experiment, a radio broadcast, or an art project.

Kids to College was designed and introduced in the Boston area in 1992-93 by a coalition of education groups to respond to the increasing dropout rate of at-risk middle school students. Since then the program has expanded to additional sites throughout Massachusetts, and to Chicago, New Orleans, Louisville and the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area. In 1996 over 2500 students and 60 higher education institutions participated in Kids to College programs.
