ANNIVERSARY LEADING LIGHTS

Producer Jack Kleinsinger's long-running **Highlights in Jazz** series usually features more inventive combinations of the music's marquee names than the city's established jazz haunts manage. The 31st-anniversary concert on February 19 will likely be just as diverse as past offerings: The stage of the Tribeca Performing Arts Center will be crowded with players from genres as disparate as bebop (Clark Terry) and Latin jazz fusion (Steve Turre). Tribeca Performing Arts Center (at the Borough of Manhattan Community College) 8pm; \$27.50, students \$20. Pianist Monty Alexander makes the reggae backbeat a base for swinging improvisation—for better or worse. Veteran trumpeter Clark Terry has been keeping mighty busy for an octogenarian who's had his share of recent health problems.

He's also been playing with a renewed vibrancy. He's on with trombone specialist Steve Turre and a rhythm section.

The brilliantly melodic trumpeter who danced with Ellington in the day and introduced hard-driving solos to legions of titans now eases in with an assured delivery, a golden touch, a crisp vocabulary, and crackling lyricism. His newest CD, "Impressions in Blue" (Telarc Jazz), is a particularly felicitous example of the mainstream modern piano trio. Alexander brings in his main influences, from his Caribbean (Jamaican) roots to Nat Cole (a marvelous mini-set tribute to the King Cole Trio with guitarist John Pizzarelli and bassist Hassan Shakur). The rest of the album is a bass and drums (Mark Taylor) trio with creative repertory choices like Duke Ellington's "Creole Love Call," a swing-out of Gershwin, "Blue Rhapsody," and a revival of the Sonny Rollins take on Johnny Mercer's "I'm an Old Cowhand." Alexander leads a trio at Smoke and the Museum, joins an all-star jam with Clark Terry, Steve Turre and others at Highlights in Jazz at the Tribeca Performing Arts Center. GK
