The Mission:

- 35.7 million tons of plastic waste was produced in the US alone. While only 8.7% of the single-use plastics were recycled or composted, (EPA, 2018)
- 275 million metric tons of plastic waste is produced and less than 9% are recycled or composted, (Ocean Conservancy, 2021).
- Every year, 8 million metric tons of the
- non-recycled plastic enters our oceans creating micro-plastics that disrupt our ocean life and pollute our clean waters.
- The Ellen MacArthur Foundation predicted that by 2050 there will be more plastics in our ocean than wildlife.
- In partnering with Beaches Go Green, it was our mission to participate in community beach clean-ups; in addition to, creating content videos to educate the youth on the importance of becoming sustainable and ecofriendly.

In partnering with non-profit organization Beaches Go Green, beach clean-ups at Atlantic/Neptune, Jacksonville, and Ponte Vedra were organized to help eliminate the waste pollution of our beaches. • In total, 1,097 volunteers, 30 bags of trash, 10 recycled bags, and 22,159 cigarette butts were collected.
