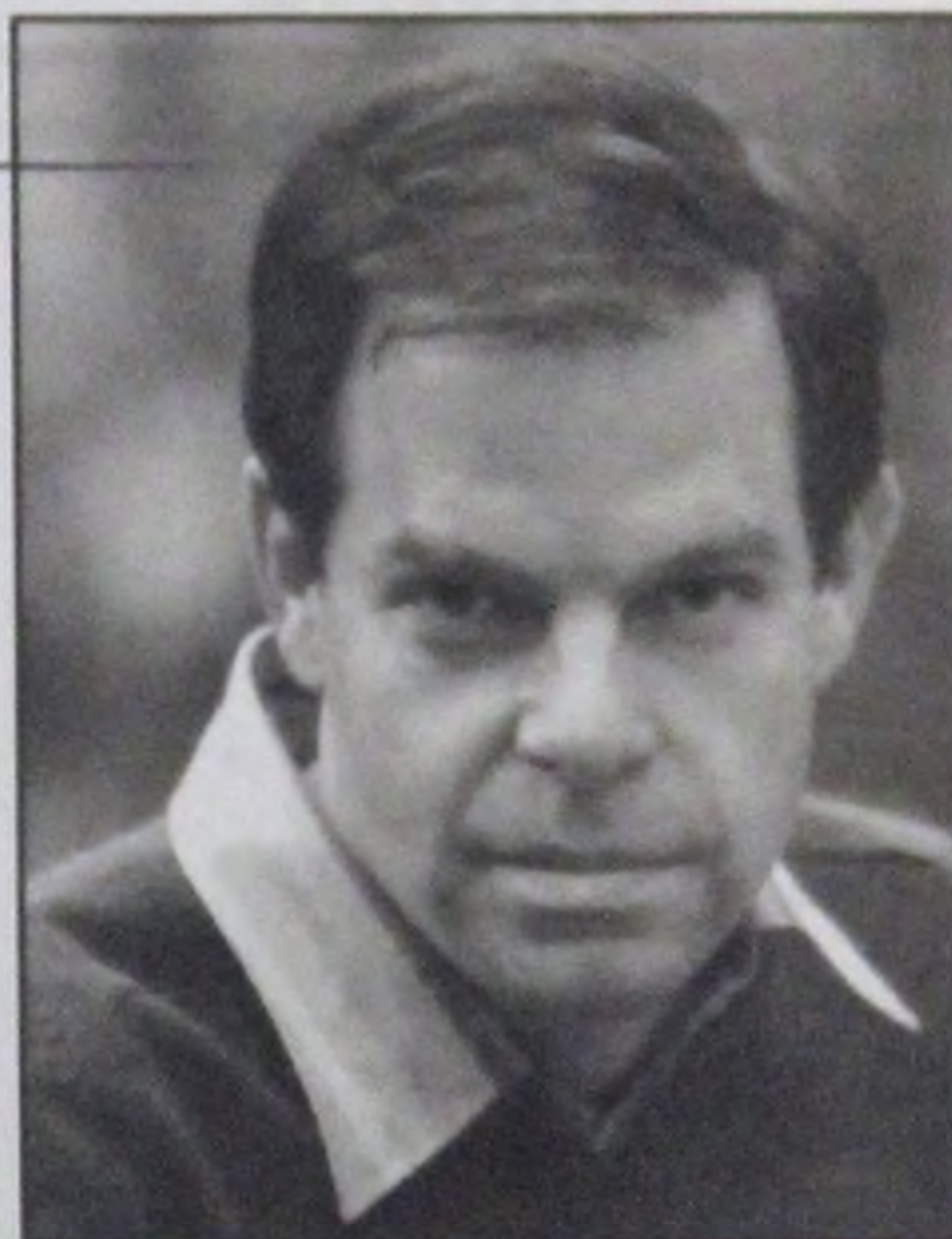

Bassist Mraz (aka "The Bad Czech") arrived from Prague during the late 60s, studied at Berklee and soon found work with a succession of leaders like Oscar Peterson, Stan Getz and Tommy Flanagan. He's headed up some memorable recordings of his own, too. We particularly admire *Bottom Lines*, a 1997 effort notable for Mraz's gorgeous singing tone. Pianist Cyrus Chestnut, who guested on that album, is one-third of a trio at this promising Highlights in Jazz program, along with Mraz and drummer Lewis Nash. Also appearing at this evening devoted to trio interplay will be guitarists Frank Vignola, James Chirillo and Bucky Pizzarelli. PB
