JUSTIFICATION FOR LEADERSHIP

The Student Government Association believes that establishing endowed leadership scholarships at the University of North Florida will serve many worthy purposes and benefit the university, its students, and eventually the community of Jacksonville.

Among the valuable attributes that student leaders learn and develop are organizational skills, self-motivation, group interaction skills, time management, and speaking and presentation skills. Being a good student leader also requires dedication and fortitude, characteristics all employers can appreciate. A student leader who has received one of these proposed scholarships would be a valuable asset to any company in Jacksonville.

As well as being future assets to the Jacksonville business community, student leaders produce numerous benefits for the university and the many groups that make-up the university community. Student leaders develop strong personal ties to the university. They will likely remain active in the university community after graduation through the Alumni Association and its many activities and fund raisers. U.N.F.'s graduates are the best promoters of the university. U.N.F.'s future student leaders will certainly project a favorable image to the Jacksonville community about U.N.F. and will hopefully attract talented students to the campus.

A student leader's greatest impact is usually on improving the college atmosphere of the campus for his or her fellow students. U.N.F.'s most outstanding student leaders wear many hats and share their time, talents, and expertise with many student groups and organizations. This can create a difficult situation for our students because of the nature of the student body. The majority of the students that attend U.N.F. are working part-time or full-time and commute to campus. This tends to limit the number of students who become actively involved on campus.

It is the aim of these scholarships to not only recognize and reward U.N.F.'s finest student leaders, but to promote leadership and to encourage others to become involved on campus. The entire university community will benefit, not only in the short-run but over the long-run. from promoting and encouraging student leadership at U.N.F.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement is executed between the University of North Florida Foundation (Foundation) and the University of North Florida Student Government Association (SGA) to establish the **Student Leadership Scholarship Award Program**. This award strives to recognize the value of student leadership in fostering a cooperative environment between students, faculty, administrators and friends of the institution. The purpose of the scholarship endowment is to reward and encourage UNF students with a record of achievement in both academics and student leadership.

To create the scholarship, the Foundation and the S.G.A. agree to contribute to the endowment in accordance with the schedule below:

SCHOLARSHIP AWARD CRITERIA

The Student Financial Aid and Scholarship Committee will determine the recipient(s) of the Scholarship. Award of the scholarship will be based upon:

1. The student's contribution to the University of North Florida community (students, faculty, staff) through his/her involvement in leadership positions;
2. The students academic standing with the University (must hold at least 2.5 cumulative G.P.A.);
3. The student's class status (must be at the junior level academically).

The Student Financial Aid and Scholarship Committee will give equal consideration to full and part-time students in awarding the Student Leadership Scholarship.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The applying student will provide:

A list of positions held and a brief description of his/her activities (in chronological order); and an essay of 200 words or less explaining why and how the student exhibited leadership in activities that specifically benefitted the University of North Florida. The student should include future goals at UNF.
