University of North Florida STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION SENATE LEGISLATION

Number SB 925-689

- WHEREAS; The 1991-92 Activity and Service Fee Budget of the University of North Florida stipulates that "Up to \$100.00 per year may be expended by a club from its A&S account for travel expenses incurred by that club", and;
- WHEREAS; This stipulation discourages clubs and organizations from using their allocated club funds for travel expenses, and;
- WHEREAS; It is the belief of the Budget and Allocations Committee that this stipulation should be supspended in order to allow clubs and organizations to use their allocated club funds for travel.
- THEREFORE; Let it be resolved that the stipulation on the club accounts in the 1991-92 A&S Budget stating that only "up to \$100.00 per year may be expended by a club from its A&S account for travel expenses incurred by that club be supspended indefinitely.
