Emerging Woman Art Show is Brevard's 2nd art exhibit highlighting women's achievements. It is a celebration of female know-how and creativity — for women are not only breaking new barriers — they are shaping new frontiers. And no one knows this better than women emerging in the arts. Their renaissance is inspiring both a new pride in domestic arts as well as an avant-garde leadership.

The U.N. has designated 1975 as International Women's Year. N.O.W. (National Organization for Women) chapters in Brevard are sponsoring this art show in celebration of International Women's Year.

Proceeds from last year's show helped establish Brevard's first Women's center, "A Woman's Place." It became a reality on March 9, 1975, International Women's Day. The Women's Center is a place where all women can find assistance and personal counseling.

This year's funds will support the center as well as other N.O.W. sponsored programs, possibly including a child-care center.

THE JUDGES

Paula Hopper — Paula Hopper, a Ridgefield, Conn. resident with an M.S. in media from the University of Bridgeport, is an independent film maker and motion picture producer. She presently is creating career education films with a grant from the Dept. of Labor. Her background includes teaching, conducting workshops and film festivals, and contributing material for the magazine, "Cartoonist Profile, International."

Linda Booth – Linda Booth of Sebastian, Florida is a potter with additional experience in fabrics (weaving and macramé) and metals (sculpture and jewelry). A former public school instructor, she holds an M.S. degree from Florida State University in art education.

Dr. Jane Rivell — Jane Rivell holds a doctorate from Florida State University with a concentration in encaustic painting. An Instructor for five years at Temple University School of Art, she is now Art Supervisor of Fine Arts for the Orange County School District and a writer of three textbooks on careers in art.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All work must be original and executed since 1971. No commercial displays, copies or kits are allowed. Paintings and drawings must be appropriately framed to be eligible for judging. Unframed work may be displayed in a portfolio. Those people entering the film making category must be on hand to show their film or films. Work must be titled and priced or indicated not for sale. A 12" x 12" white card with your name, space number, city of residence and categories in which you wish to be judged must be attached to your display.

Artists must exhibit on both days to be eligible for awards. An entry is an obligation to show.

A fee of 10 dollars will be charged for each 12 x 12 feet of space. A special entry fee will be charged for students in senior high school or younger. This special fee is 5 dollars. Only one artist may exhibit in each space. Space assignments must be made in advance. Last minute changes at the show can not be arranged.

CATEGORIES AND AWARDS

Cash prizes of 640 dollars and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded. Purchase awards will also be presented. A special "Art for Art's Sake" award — a gift certificate from Artist's Corner in Melbourne — will be presented to the work which best exemplifies the show's theme, "The Emerging Woman." Also a special domestic arts award will be given in the craft category. No awards will be made in categories with less than six entries.
