NUMBER SB-99S-1166

SB-99S-1166 adds a time limit in impeachment hearings

Whereas: The Constitution and Statutes Committee is standing committee of the Student Government

Association Senate, which is responsible for "jurisdiction over all Student Government Association Statutes, except for Title VI and VIII...," as stated in Title IX, subsection

901.1.C.1.a., and;

Whereas: The Impeachment Statutes are to be reviewed and changed as the Constitution and Statutes

Committee sees fit, and;

Whereas: 700.1C states: "Once on the Floor of the Senate, debate shall be limited...." and;

Whereas: The Constitution and Statutes Committee recommends that a time limit should be placed on how

long each person debates, and;

Therefore: LET IT BE ENACTED THAT SECTION 700.1C BE CHANGED TO READ "ONCE ON

THE FLOOR OF THE SENATE, DEBATE SHALL BE LIMITED TO FIVE MINUTES

FROM EACH SPEAKER."
