Whereas:	The Student Government Association of the University of North Florida was established to

Whereas: The Constitution and Statues Committee is standing committee of the Student Government Association Senate, which is responsible for "jurisdiction over Student Government Association

Statutes," and;

Whereas: Title XII, Sec1200.5.A states: "Agencies will be eligible for termination when it is determined,

through a Student Senate Review, that the Agency is no longer providing the services for which it was created." And because this is unclear and to provide for more consistency throughout the

Statutes, and;

Therefore: Let it be enacted that 1200.5 A of Title XII be changed to read: "In the event when an agency is

no longer providing the service for which it was created, the agency may be brought in front of the CSC committee on the charges of Non-compliance. Upon a majority vote by the committee or 8 senators, a bill will be drafted and brought to the Senate floor for a 2/3 majority vote by the next schedule meeting. If the bill is passed by the president, termination will occur. If the bill

vetoed it will require a 5/6 vote to overturn the veto by the student senate."
