6 7		a. Senate At-Large and the graduate seat (Seats 1-41) shall be limited to two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) per candidate.

2 3 4 5 6 7 8		605.5 B. 4Failure to submit a candidate expense statement no later then 5:00 PM on the second business day following any election shall incur a minor violation, a second minor violation on the third business day, and a third minor violation on the fourth business day following an election. Late submissions must include documentation in writing acceptable to University policy and shall be reviewed by the Elections Commission for approval.
9 10 11	Therefore:	Let it be enacted, by the University of North Florida Student Government, that the proposed revisions are made into Title VI of the Student Government Statutes.
