The Student Government President shall forward a name to the Student Senate for confirmation. B. A majority vote of the Student Senate is required for confirmation, **Chapter 309: Executive Transition Period** The Transition Period begins upon the validation of election results by the 309.1 Senate and concludes after the first Senate meeting of the term. 309.2 During this transition period, the outgoing administration must transfer all records and files regarding Student Government to the newly elected administration. The incoming and outgoing administrations shall share all office space 309.3 allocated to the executive branch for purposes of conducting business relating to the transition.
