## SENATE LEGISLATION SB-11SA-2527

Student Government

1		SB-11SA-2527 : Executive Agency Formation Reform
2 3	Whereas:	The Student Government of the University of North Florida was established to represent student concerns in all University wide matters; and
4 5 6 7	Whereas:	The Student Senate is the legislative body of the University of North Florida's Student Government given the responsibility of carrying out such legislative acts that are necessary and proper for the Student Body of the University of North Florida; and
8 9	Whereas:	Legislation dealing with necessary and proper statutory revisions shall be considered by Student Senate; and
10	Whereas:	Title XI is in need of revision.
11 13 14 15	Whereas:	Title XI has grown to be incongruent with Student Government Statutes. This measure seeks to not only realign Title XI with the rest of the statutes, but also to ameliorate the agency formation process. The process is too unnecessarily burdensome and makes forming an agency less timely than is beneficial to the student body.
16	Therefore;	The following revisions are being made to Title XI;
17		TITLE XI: THE EXECUTIVE AGENCY STATUTE
18 19 20	Chapter 1100.8 Forming an <u>Executive</u> Agency	
21 22 23 24		The forming of an <u>executive</u> agency, as follows, is a process that <del>will persist no less than</del> three fiscal years can occur with the express approval of the Student Government President.
24 25 26		<u>A.</u> Any persons who want an agency formed must first-acquire 20%-of student body signatures during the fall semester only.
20 27 28 29 30 31 32		<u>B.</u> After acquiring the aforementioned signatures, the persons must have put a budget and general proposal before the Budget and Allocations Committee and the Constitutions and Statutes Committee, respectively. An agency proposal consisting of both a budgetary and constitutional component shall be submitted to the Senate President and added to the agenda under Legislation considered for 1 <sup>st</sup> Reading for the next regularly-scheduled Senate meeting.

1		SB-11SA-2527 : Executive Agency Formation Reform
2 3 4 5 6	<u>C.</u>	The proposal's budgetary and constitutional components are to be forwarded to the Budget and Allocations Committee and the Constitution and Statues Committee, respectively.
5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13		1. The budget proposal must include monies for one fiscal year. The Budget and Allocations Committee is to review the proposal and, not appropriate funds at this time. The budgetary component must outline estimated costs for one fiscal year and can be composed with the assistance of the SG Business Manager, Treasurer, Agency Advisor, and/or Budget and Allocations Chair. The Budget and Allocations Committee shall review and vote on the proposed budget, but refrain from appropriating funds until the formation process has been completed.
14 15		2. If the Constitution and Statues Committee does not pass the Agency proposal, then it dies, or can be brought back to the floor by eight senators. The Constitution and Statutes Committee will review and vote on the constitutional component.
18 19 20 21		3. If both components of the agency proposal are passed, the revised proposal shall be added to the agenda under Legislation considered for 2 <sup>nd</sup> Reading for the next regularly-scheduled Senate Meeting.
22 23 24 25	<u>D.</u>	The proposals need to then be brought to the floor before the last Senate Meeting of the Fall Semester. The proposal must be approved by the Senate before the conclusion of the budget deliberation process for the upcoming fiscal year.
26 27 28		<ol> <li>It takes 2/3 a vote from Senate to pass the Agency Proposal. The agency proposal requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Senate to pass.</li> </ol>
29 30 31		<ol> <li>After the legislation passes, the President of Student Government must sign off on it. If passed, the agency proposal must be signed by the Student Body President.</li> </ol>
32 33 34		<ol> <li>If the Student Government President vetoes the proposal, then it will be referred back to the Senate.</li> </ol>
35 36		4. It will then take 2/3 of present Senators to override the President's veto.
37 38 39 40	<del>D.</del>	——After the legislation passes, the Constitution and Statues Committee will draw up a referendum and request the Elections, Selections, and Appointments Committee for it to be placed on either the special voting session or the spring ballot, whichever is the quickest route.
·	E.	The Agency Proposal, after affirmation by the Senate and/or Student Government President, and the student body, it must then be approved by the University President.

2 3 4		The agency proposal, once properly passed through the legislative process, will officially create an executive agency of Student Government.
5 6 7	F.	Once formed, the Agency agency must shall be placed on probationary status for two years.
8 9 10 11 12		<ol> <li>During the probationary period, not only does the agency have to follow all of the statues rules, but they must also present a monthly report to the Budget and allocations committee. During the probationary period, the agency director must present a monthly financial report to the Budget and Allocations Committee.</li> </ol>
13 14 15		<ol> <li>If there are three noncompliance strikes against the newly formed Agency, then this Agency will be terminated. Three successful noncompliance strikes against the newly formed agency shall result in its termination in accordance with Chapter 1100, Section 1100.5: Termination.</li> </ol>
