1		SB-06S-1971: Title VI – Revision of Definitions				
2 3	Whereas:	The Student Government of the University of North Florida was established to represent student concerns in all University wide matters, and;				
4 5 6	Whereas:	The Student Senate is the legislative body of the University of North Florida's Student Government, given the responsibility of carrying out such legislative acts that are necessary and proper for the Student Body of the University of North Florida;				
7 8	Whereas:	Legislation dealing with necessary and proper statutory revisions shall be considered by the Student Senate;				
9	Whereas:	Title VI is need of revision;				
10 11	Whereas:	Title VI is either currently missing relative definitions, parts of definitions or simply has poorly worded definitions which require revision;				
12	Whereas:	The following revisions will be made to Title VI:

Business day – As referred to within this Statute the Election Code, shall be defined as being weekdays (Monday through Friday) during academic sessions. Academic Sessions include Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters only. Spring Break shall not be considered as business days.  Campaigning – All active or passive publicizing and/or distribution of campaign materials (i.e.: flyers, handbills, food, websites, etc) which solicit or call for support of a candidate(s) or party for an elected elective office of the Student Government during the campaign period, excluding verbal campaigning.			
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32		H.	Constituency – The body of voters or the residents of a district represented by an elected legislator or official; the district so represented by an elected or appointed member of Student Government.			
		ТТ.	Financial Statement – Documents identifying the source or acquisition of all known campaign expenses and campaign contributions.			
		I.	Constitutional Referendum Amendment – A referendum held for the purpose of amending the Student Government Constitution.

5 6 7		R.	Polling Region – Area A seventy-five feet (75') around polls radius surrounding the polling station.
8 9 10		U.	Sample Ballot – A ballot posted to the public prior to printing of $\underline{\text{official}}$ ballots for an election.
10 11 12 13		W.	Ticket – Two (2) candidates cooperatively engaged in a campaign for <u>student</u> <u>body</u> president and vice-president of SG.
14 15 16		<u>BB.</u>	Campaign Period – The timeframe which begins upon the close of filing and ends forty-eight (48) hours after the last day of elections; that allows a candidate(s) to publicly advertise, solicit and promote their candidacy.
18 19 20		EE.	Election Cycle – The timeframe which begins upon the availability of the Declaration of Intent until validation of the election by the Student Senate.
21 22 23 24 25		FF.	Absentee Ballot – The official medium by which a qualified member of the electorate, who is unable to visit the polls on election day, may cast his/her vote prior to the opening of an election provided the guidelines for filing an absentee ballot are met.
26 27 28 29		GG.	Campaign Violation – A penalty incurred by a candidate and/or party for violation of the Election Code during an election cycle, as outlined in Section 605.5 of this Title.
30 31 32 33		<u>НН.</u>	Close of Filing – The deadline in which a Candidate Application is due as outlined in Section 604.2.A.2 of this Title, which takes priority over the deadline for filing Write-in Candidacy.
34 35 36		<u>JJ.</u>	Student Registrar – A list, in either electronic or paper format, containing the names and identification numbers of all actively enrolled UNF students.
37 38 39 40		MM.	Flag – A means of identifying the name of a student within the Student Registrar List who has cast a ballot.
		NN.	Candidate – A student who has properly submitted all of the necessary paperwork and has met the eligibility requirements for seeking an elective

10 11		RR.	Campaign Staff – A person(s) publicly campaigning for a candidate(s) or party under the direction of said candidate(s) or party.
