Elections Supervisor.

- I. Publish adequate information concerning elections in the official campus newspaper, and, beginning two (2) weeks prior to the election, publicize its date, time, location of the voting booths, candidates and appropriate procedures for voting. After the election, the Elections Supervisor will publish results in a paper of general campus circulation the official campus newspaper.
- J. <u>Adequately publicize and</u> conduct at least one <u>(1)</u> public debate or forum during the period of active campaigning where any and all candidates are invited to present their platforms verbally and to be seen by the electorate. Weather conditions permitting, this forum should be outdoors and in an area centrally located and accessible to students.
- M. <u>Shall ensure that all absentee ballots submitted and awaiting</u> <u>tabulation are secure from damage, loss, theft, or alteration.</u>
- N. Issue Certificates of Elecstion to each officer elected in accordance with this <u>Statute Title</u>, which must be signed by the <u>SG acting</u> <u>Student Body</u> President and the Elections Supervisor.
- ⊖ <u>A</u>. Form and preside over the Elections Commission (<u>EC</u>), assuming an unbiased role in all cases. The Elections <u>Commission must meet at least once</u> during the two (<u>2</u>) weeks prior to the election; and see all complaints <u>to invalidate</u> on the business day following the <u>close of the election</u>.
- P<u>B.</u> Appoint a collection of nonpartisan poll workers from within Senate and train these poll workers in their responsibilities and duties in the operation of the polls.
- R. To maintain an accurate list of active senators' contact information.

The Attorney General shall assume the role of prosecutor in all cases 6 pertaining to specific campaign violations. The accused student candidate(s) 7 will be responsible for his or her own defense. In disputes between two (2) or 8 more candidates, each candidate will represent themselves before the 9 committee Elections Commission. 10 11 D. The membership of the ESAC who are not candidates and any other senators 12 not affiliated with campaigning who wish to participate actively participate with 13 the commission shall be unbiased and aware of all policies and procedures surrounding the election. Each member shall have one (1) vote in all decisions 15 made by the commission. 16 17 E. All members are responsible for enforcing all rules and procedures outlined 18 herein and all other rules/laws applicable to the candidates. Violations must be 19 reported to the Elections Supervisor immediately. Formally written violations 20 submitted to the Elections Supervisor by a member of the Elections 21 Commission will result in that member abstaining from all votes pertaining to 22 said violation during the EC hearings. 23 24 G. The Elections Supervisor shall vote only in the case of a tie among the 25 committee commission-26 **Therefore:** Let it be enacted, by the University of North Florida Student Senate that the July 1, 2006 27 effective date be overridden so that these proposed revisions are made into Title VI of the 28 Student Government Statutes as soon as possible.
