- 302.2 The President shall be ultimately responsible for all job duties/responsibilities of all Executive Branch members with the exceptions of Treasurer and Attorney General.
- Administrative Authority 302.3
 - Α. The President may organize the Executive Branch, as he/she deems necessary and proper within the limits imposed by the Student Government Constitution and Statutes.
 - В. The President must establish the Executive Policies and Procedures prior to the first day of classes of the Fall semester.
 - C. If a new Executive Branch position is created, the President must notify the Senate President through an Executive Order within five (5) business days of its creation.
 - D. The Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in his or her absence only in under extreme circumstances, such as physical incapacitation, which makes it impossible to discharge the duties of the office, or upon his or her the President's request.
